**Agenda Item:** Climate Change

*Affirming* the support of sustainable land use forest conservation and reforestation,

*Encouraging* for political and financial incentives for a global industrial refitting of our power in infrastructure away from fossil fuels and toward sustainable energy production and storage,

*Recognizing* the human generated greenhouse gas emissions from fossil fuel combustion,

*Acknowledging* the deforestation and wildfire suppression are making forests more vulnerable to fires and reducing the ability of forests to sequester and store carbon

*Fully alarmed* about the implications of ocean warming, ocean acidification resulting from carbon dioxide emissions, sea level rise and other impacts of climate change for billions of people reliant on the ocean for food and livelihood

*Recognizes* that political and financial incentives for a global industrial refitting of our power in infrastructure away from fossil

fuels and toward sustainable energy production and storage is of utmost necessity,

Deeply conscious of the fact that some member nations may not have the optimal resources for the goals set by this committee

**Stating for an international cooperation on this issue,**

*Noticing* that the director general and all components of IUCN is required to include ocean mitigation and adaptation in all relevant climate change-related programmes and to support the actions listed below,

a) commit to Nationally Determined Contributions under the Paris Agreement

*Advising* all committees of the UN to deeply commit itself to the cause of climate change, knowing that the topic of climate change is a defined problem in the UN Charter.

1. *Having considered* damage of climate change to marine organism;
  - a) Prevention of spillage of plastics into oceans;
    - i. Every country that have coast to oceans or seas in United Nations (UN) should consider safer options for garbage dumps,
    - ii. Inspections to be carried out by United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP),
    - iii. Augmenting environmental non-governmental organisations which is Greenpeace,
  - b) Protection of endangered organisms;
    - i. United Nations (UN) will choose several safe national habitats and protect many endangered species at those designated areas,

- ii. There living areas will be protected,
  - iii. Those who do not comply will be punished with public service,
2. *Proclaims* that the changes of climate change can be delayed and minimized by;
- a) Increasing the usage of biodegradable plastics,
  - b) Legislating bans and fees,
  - c) Regulating and inspecting the already existing laws of carbon emissions of any type of vessel, whether that be naval, aviatational or ground transportation,
  - d) Public information campaigns ,
  - e) Charging citizens for the lowly use of plastic bags to deter people from using plastic bags,
  - f) Advising member governments to establish the necessary governmental institutions for;
    - i. The upholding of the laws suggested in this resolution paper,
    - ii. The inspection of other government instutions; whether that be local, state or any type of institute that can do any sort of actions that might be harmful for the climate,
3. *Declares* the 24th of March as the World's Climate Day in order to plant trees in this particular day which is supported by the governments and related foundations which will be provided by International Monetary Fund (IMF) should pay the following;
- a) The minimum basic needs of people who regularly attend plating tree educations,
  - b) People who participate in tree planting activities,
  - c) Local governments that celebrate the day by planting trees,
    - i. Necessary transport methods for gatherings and parades,
    - ii. Security and logistics expenses of organizing local concerts and entertainment activities,
4. *Expecting* reducing the usage of fossil fuels and plastics by the help of followings;
- a) That member nations encourage the usage of public transport and carbon-friendly transport methods,

- b) renewable energy sources should be used in different areas,
  - c) Advise individual citizens to use electric vehicles instead of petrol or benzine powered vehicles and impose deterring taxes to both the fuel and related fees of purchasing a car,
5. *States* that any member nation that does not obey by the agreements of this resolution may be subject to suspension from being a signatory of these necessary international agreements.
  6. *Advises* that member nations should be transparent in their reports to the UNHCHR, following the rules of Article 31 and Article 43 thoroughly.
